

## Former Badger coach hired by Boys and Girls Club of Dane County

MADISON (WKOW) --- The Boys & Girls Club of Dane County has hired, former UW Madison Women's Basketball Coach, Bobbie Kelsey-Grayson to lead corporate fundraising efforts to support local kids in sports, wellness and education programs.
